Join the Norfolk Department of Recreation, Parks & Open Space, Bureau of Cemeteries' Bobette Nelson for a pleasant walk through the pastoral grounds of historic Calvary Cemetery, est. 1877. Calvary's history begins with Spanish-American War veterans interred on the same lot as U.S. Colored Troops who served in the Civil War. It spans the post-Civil War era, Reconstruction & the Civil Rights era to present day.

Visit the final resting places of 30 Norfolk Notables including:

- **Plummer Bernard Young, Sr.**, founder and past publisher of the *Norfolk Journal and Guide*
- **Reverend William Mack Lee**, personal servant to General Robert E. Lee & faith leader
- **Charles Clarence Bullock**, National Gallery portrait artist
- **Emma V. Kelley**, founder of Norfolk Temple 1-A of the Daughters of the Elks Auxiliary
